Check on Contractors Licensing and Association rules BEFORE you begin your project

We recommend that PML members check with our Administration Office before starting any improvements to their PML property, such as building a home or starting a renovation project. Whether it is a small retaining wall, new driveway or deck replacement, check on the rules first. Since the beginning of the year, we have been forced to enforce the CC&R's and red-tag several projects because the member or their contractor failed to get the proper permits or approval. Who are you hiring?

In addition, it is important to check out the contractors and vendors you want to hire BEFORE you hire them. We have received complaints that many do not have the proper licenses or insurance. Do not just go by local references or recommendations from online social media sites. Roofers, asphalt contractors, deck builders, tree removal services, landscape companies, plumbers, carpenters etc. are all covered by California state regulations and County ordinances.

We have seen way too many members get burned by shoddy work or issues with unlicensed contractors/uninsured workers. Members should perform their own due diligence as to the reputation and history of the contractor or provider and their licensing. We recommend getting bids and quotes in writing, insisting on a written contract and having it reviewed by your lawyer.
