The Holiday season is in the rear-view mirror, the days are getting longer but the nights are still cold and the heart of winter is just getting underway. This is quiet time at Pine Mountain Lake when visits are at their lowest numbers for the year.

The Grill at Pine Mountain Lake is open, and the food and service is great. They have some delicious specials that are only offered during the winter months. So make a reservation and enjoy some time with friends, family and the warm hospitality.

Pine Mountain Lake has had its first snowfall and the road crews did a great job clearing the roads. The Maintenance department are the folks who are on the job clearing the snow and fallen trees when the weather is rough. They work hard and are on call 24x7 keeping our road passable and they deserve our thanks.

The weather service is forecasting yet another dry winter. The good news is that this may help reduce the erosion problems created by the Rim Fire. The bad news is that what has not burned will be even dryer this next year. So while the weather is cool, get some exercise and do some more brush clearing. January is also the month that Hetch Hetchy performs their annual water pipe and tunnel maintenance, so please make an effort to reduce your water usage and conserve.

The Marina Store/Cafe Project is progressing and the analysis and selection of the successful bid for construction will

be done in the first week of January. It will be a challenge to complete the project prior to the Memorial Day weekend. This team effort will again rely on the hard work of the Maintenance department clearing and prepping the site combined with the contractor who will construct the new building.

The other exciting news is about the efforts to build multi-use and mountain biking trails around and within Pine Mountain Lake. The process is in an early stage but Pine Mountain Lake Association is working with the US Forest Service, Groveland Ranger District and the IMBA chapter Groveland Trail Heads Mountain Biking Club to potentially develop and interlinking network of trails. Check out their web page at http://grovelandtrailheads.org/

Our planning for new trail development will initially focus on two main areas within Pine Mountain Lake. The first area is part of the Long Gulch Ranch on the North side of Ferretti Road behind the Stables. PML currently leases this property for equestrian trail rides, and now for other uses. We are looking into where to put in new trails, marking trails for level of difficulty and organizing the mixed use with safety and compatible uses in mind. The second area is behind the campgrounds in Unit 16. There we have the existing archery and gun ranges and a network of roads. We would like to create more trails for hiking and biking and have this be a draw for the campgrounds.



Backing up to this area are some potential trails in the National Forrest.



Generally speaking, most renters abide by the Association rules, especially those that are managed by professionals and members who care what happens to their homes and the neighbors.

Unfortunately there are a few property owners that do not take the time to properly vet prospective tenants. As a result, other members are negatively impacted. These inconsiderate property owners create a constant burden on the Association and neighbors and it translates to an increased cost to us all. Bad tenants move from one home to another in PML, without any due diligence performed by the landlord. What is inexplicable is that inconsiderate landlords end up paying

Earlier in the year I was cautiously optimistic when 100% of the candidates running for election included some messaging about reducing our assessment. So imagine my disappointment when I received my annual assessment and learned that rather than go down or stay the same as promised during elections, the assessment actually went up by some 4.5%. When are the elected officials and business managers running the association going to realize that continuously increasing our assessment is not preserving value, but rather destroying it? There is a widespread housing recovery that has occurred throughout California where home prices have improved on average over 10% this past year, yet home prices in Pine Mountain Lake continue to be stagnant with no increase at all and vacant lots still cannot even be given away for less than \$500! Now of course our community needs to be maintained, but there is a huge difference between maintaining our community and investing in unnecessary upgrades that we simply cannot afford. In my line of work we have a saying that goes "spend the company money like it was your own" and I challenge our elected officials and hired business managers to start doing the same with the association's money, because from my perspective we are currently failing miserably. What a pity!

PMLA Money Matters

Math quiz!! What is difference between 3.16% and 2.28%? The obvious answer is 0.88%. In the case of PMLA the real answer is \$17. Do I have you completely confused? If so, bear with me and it will all become clear (I hope).

By now all of the Association's property owners have received their Budget/ Assessment Package for 2014. If you have not received yours please contact the Administration office (209-962-8600) immediately. Within that package is your "invoice" for the 2014 annual assessment. As I indicated last month the amount for 2014 is \$1,956. This represents an increase of \$60 a year over the 2013 amount.

Regular readers of this column know that I have stressed the impact that lot mergers have on our annual assessment. For 2014 the increase in assessment caused directly by lot mergers is the aforementioned .88%. Without the 30+ lot mergers that took place in 2013 the increase in assessment for 2014 would have been 2.28% instead of the actual increase of 3.16%.

On the surface this appears to be a minor difference. In fact it translates into the \$17 per year that I mentioned in the opening paragraph of this article. That is almost \$1.50 per month for every property owner within PML. In addition this impact does not end with 2014. The affect of these mergers along with those occurring in the past as well as those that will occur in the years ahead is ongoing and never ending.

By continuously reducing the property owner base within the Association there is a continuous reduction in the number of property owners who share in the costs of keeping PML maintained to the standards that each and every property owner expects. These "lost" lots will never be regained. As such they have a negative impact on those that remain every year as long as the Association exists. The dollar value of these assessments over the past 40 years is well into the millions of dollars.

Why do I bring this up now? The answer is education and full disclosure. All property owners have the right to know what causes fluctuations in their assessment each year. Of course the vast majority of these changes are the result of the ever increasing cost of caring for an Association that is over 40 years old. However the impact of the continuing number of lot mergers cannot be underestimated.

Based on the inability of the membership to approve an amendment to our governing documents limiting the impact of these mergers this process will continue to be a factor in future assessment levels. The Board and Management team will continue to strive to control our costs going forward, however it is important to remember that one factor impacting assessment levels is out of everyone's control.

Well that's it for this month. On the Lake

I'm writing this in mid-December wishing that Christmas would have come two weeks early so we could have had a white one. From that, you can assume that I'm predicting we won't have much more precipitation before Christmas. I rarely try to predict the weather more than a few days out, but all of the long range models show us pretty dry through the end of December. As you read this, how did they do?

If you had a chance to enjoy views of the Lake all shrouded in white, you will no doubt have more appreciation for what an amazing asset it is to our community. I didn't see many footprints in the new fallen snow on the beaches, but I'm sure a lot of you took notice from afar. Despite the fact that the Lake doesn't get much human use this time of year, there are still things going on out there.

On November 18, we did a "profile" of the water from top to bottom. This is a routine check-up that helps us determine the long term health of the Lake. This late season profile also helps the divers prepare for the conditions they will encounter when they dive to inspect the dam release gates and the hydraulics that operate the gates. They also inspect the lakebed in front of the gates to make sure there aren't any logs or debris that might interfere with the gates when we do our annual test of the gates. The dive took place on December 10th and everything checked out OK. The actual test of the gates will be scheduled very soon. This is something we do every year to satisfy the Division of Safety of Dams (DSOD) and to assure that we can release water quickly if it should ever be necessary.

After the gate test, we sometimes leave

one of the gates partially open to release some of the nutrient rich water from the bottom. This is a well proven method used by limnologists around the world to help keep lakes healthy. This year, we aren't going to do that. With the lack of significant rain so far, the Lake is already 4 feet from being full. The Lake is full when it's at 2,550 feet above sea level. And please don't ask me to explain how sea level is determined. That is a science into itself.

Anyhow, on December 10th, the lake level was 2545.8 ft. That's pretty low, but some of you probably know that it has been lower. During the drought in the 70's, the Lake went down to 2542.8 feet in March 1977, and 2543.9 feet in December 1975. That's two of the lowest levels I could currently find in my records. I'm in the process of compiling all of the dam readings that have been done since the dam was built. Those data have been collected by the dedicated maintenance staff since 1970. It's an extremely important set of data that not only assures that the dam is safe, but also helps us plan water releases and comply with our Water Rights

So, how about ending the year with one BIG SHOUT OUT to all of the PML maintenance staff who have been caring for the Lake and dam since day one!

Until next time... Enjoy the Lake

Community Standards BY DENNIS PIPAL, COMMUNITY STANDARDS DIRECTOR

Winter weather can bring about some troubling occurrences. Every year we can get a windstorm and the damage it does to our trees is a good example of what weather can do. And an especially heavy snow fall stresses out our trees and creates a mess of downed limbs, entire trees can fall, and even cause damage to our structures.

One of the most head scratching occurrences is when a member's tree/limb falls on a neighboring member's Lot. Who cleans this up? Who is responsible for the damage it may have caused?

First of all, this is a matter between member Lot Owners. We, as an Association, can and will provide contact information so a member can contact the other member to start the conversation about who is going to do what.

Second, we recommend members work something out between themselves. If you are the type who likes to use your computer to gather information, Google this scenario, TREE FALLS ACROSS PROPERTY LINES. The miracle of the internet will give you a feel for the rights and responsibilities of the parties involved and it may surprise you!! However, this education is no replacement for the counsel of a licensed attorney.

Another interesting topic is tree removal and tree limbing. When do members need approval and when don't you?

PMLA rules require members to ask for approval on any tree or limb 5" in diameter or larger. It's as simple as that. The US Forestry Service has rules also. If you intend to sell, barter or trade any of the wood from your tree removal then you need to apply for a permit. If you intend to use the wood for personal use such as, firewood for your own use, taking to the compost dump or donating the wood, then no permit is required.

During our current Fall/Spring Fuel Reduction inspections we may have placed a ribbon around a tree in excess of 5 inches. These have our approval and no request is required. We are also noticing a lot of dead limbs on live trees. This is common among certain varieties especially pine trees. As the tree matures the bottom limbs die. These need to be removed up to 15 feet.

We are here to help members in this process whether you want to eliminate trees for fire abatement purposes such as dead trees or the thinning of live trees, or because they are diseased or damaging your property, we can help you through the process of getting the right approvals. Our beautiful trees are an important natural resource and these rules are in place to make sure we don't artificially alter the beauty of our landscape. The Tree Removal Request form is located on our website under the Fire Safety tab at www. pinemountainlake.com.

And last, for those members who are using these winter months for continued Lot cleaning, Good For You! I think you figured it out that it's easier to do this work in the winter months. We encourage your efforts and remember, KEEP IT SIMPLE....Get rid of the dead stuff, thin out the live stuff, and limb up those trees.

All Contractors Performing Work in PML are Required to Follow PMLA Rules and Regulations

The following are some "common violations." Please do your part to maintain a harmonious environment for all to enjoy. Remember: The PML property Owner is held responsible for those they hire.

Vehicle use:

- 1. Exceeding the posted speed limit
- 2. Driving in a reckless manner
- 3. Following another through an access gate or allowing others to follow you through
- 4. Parking on street (road shoulders OK)

Personal Conduct:

- 1. Allowing loud music
- 2. Uttering abusive language or conduct that would be offensive to a reasonable person

Work Related Conduct

- 1. Starting work before 7am or continuing after 7pm
- 2. Allowing dogs at construction sites
- 3. Performing work on Sunday
- 4. Cutting down a tree in excess of 5" without PMLA approval
- 5. Trespassing on neighboring property
- 6. Using neighbors water or electricity without written permission
- 7. Leaving construction signs longer than 5 days after work has been completed
- 8. Nailing signs to trees
- 9. Storing building materials on street or easement
- 10. Beginning exterior construction without PML Association approval

Renting Your PML Property?

In order to keep our community safe and secure, we require all renters to register with the PML Administration Office. The Property Owner must pay the Renter Registration Fee in the amount stated on the current fee schedule and provide the Association with a signed copy of the lease or rental agreement. You must notify your tenant to bring a copy of the lease or rental agreement to the Administration Office so they can register and obtain the proper access cards. The registration process takes approximately fifteen minutes. If your tenants move, please contact the Administration Office

so we can update our records.

Owners who rent their homes will be contacted twice a year to verify the rental status has not changed. Renters who have changed residences but still reside within PML must re-register with the new lease or rental agreement.

Last month's historical archive photo was of the Margaret Simmons Home. A horse drawn wagon is seen crossing the bridge over Garrote Creek which runs on the west side of the house. The transitional Neoclassical-to-Craftsman style house was built in 1899 by Edward Cobden, who is credited with the construction of several of Groveland's prestigious Victorians.

Margaret Lenan was born in 1839 in Ireland and arrived in New York by ship in 1857. In New York she married Mathew Coyle in 1859 or 1860 and had daughter Mary Ann. By August 1863, the family was living on Moccasin Creek in Tuolumne County. There Walter, Charles, Thomas,



and Kitty were born.

Margaret was widowed in 1867 when Mathew Coyle died of "miner's consumption". With five young children to support, Margaret took a position as a housekeeper for Robert Benton Simmons in Deer Flat. They were married in May 1869 and had four children, Robert, Margaret, Edward, and Elizabeth.

In 1892, Margaret was widowed for the second time. By 1900 she moved into the house her sons Walter and Thomas Coyle had built for her and lived there until 1929 when she died at age 90. Margaret is buried at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Cemetery in Big Oak Flat. Margaret Simmons' home was extensively renovated in 1999 and is now operated as the All Seasons Groveland Inn Bed & Breakfast.

Healthy Habits

FROM PINE MOUNTAIN THERAPY

HEALING AFTER SURGERY

Having surgery is a huge decision and a major life event. You will never get the first 6 weeks post surgery back. There are no doovers. As you plan your surgery you need to plan your recovery.

All surgery requires cutting living tissue and many include cutting bone. Arthroscopic surgeries with very small port incision are deceptive. Extensive and precise repair work went on under the surface. Recent advancements in technique and pain control have also decreased the amount of postoperative pain that patient have to endure. No one wants pain, but pain is a warning to our brains that we "shouldn't do that". Take away the pain and given human beings innate need to be super stars post operative injuries occur more often than we would like.

This is what one of our patients said recently 4 weeks after back surgery, "I felt pretty good, so I helped my son chop and bring in the wood". Really? And he thought that was a good idea and was so proud. Activities that stress the surgical site will result in damaging the surgical tissue, change the formation of scar tissue and set you up for ongoing problems that could have been avoided.

Here are some hints in post surgical planning:

BALANCE REST AND ACTIVITY:

Tiring easily after surgery is normal. Local and general anesthesia takes a toll on the body. But it is also important to get up and move around, as the doctor recommends, for circulation, lung function, digestive function etc. Getting up and walking every hour, if you can't walk at least stand and march in place, if you can't stand, move your arms and legs in bed, but do move. Then rest. You need both.


EAT WELL: Your tissues need nutrients to heal. Small, frequent, easy to digest meals high in protein are important. The adage that chicken soup cures all is close to the truth. Soups made from slow cooked bone broths are full of tissue enhancing nutrients.

BOWEL CARE: Start planning your bowel routine before surgery. Talk to your doctor about stool softeners. Have fiber rich foods available, have a water bottle ready to sip on throughout the day. Don't wait for this to be a problem, be proactive.

WOUND HEALING: There are three phases to wound healing. The first two take about 4 weeks for the scar to be produced to pull the edges of the wound together. Ask your doctor about what medications you can take during this phase. We are learning that antiinflammatories like ibuprofen and Aleve can interfere with healing. Once the scar is formed, about 6 weeks, massage and touch it. Skin is a living fabric. Layers of skin will adhere together and may make the scar uncomfortable. Gently rubbing and massaging the scar helps it to remodel with more flexibility.

Healing takes time, respect the healing process. Respect the efforts of your surgeons. And above all listen to your therapist.

YES Project in Groveland

Substance abuse and suicide are problems with youth in our community, and the YES Partnership in Sonora is preparing a proposal for a Federal Drug-Free Communities grant for \$125,000 a year for five years, renewable. This project would serve southern Tuolumne and northern Mariposa Counties. YES has addressed this in Sonora for 28 years and have a number of programs we can use, including the very successful Friday Night Live option for healthy activities.

The grant proposal is due in March, and GAINs has put together a working committee to get started. As required by the grant, they will be establishing a community coalition of

Food and Weight Issues



Addictions come in many forms. Most of us associate drugs and alcohol as the most common addictions but many people develop habitual behavior that is of little benefit, unhealthy or even harmful to their lives. A few examples besides drugs and alcohol are: shopping, sex, hoarding and food. Dieting, body dissatisfaction and a desire to be thin like the models in the entertainment industry has become a major problem with young and older folks alike.

Food addictions can be lethal. Overeating, starving, binge eating and purging create havoc with the natural functions of the body. Obesity is a symptom of emotional challenges. Some people think this is an excuse of the weak and needy. Yet, if we look at our childhood we were given treats when we were sad, we earned treats when we got good grades and we enjoy the nurturing benefits of what we have come to call "comfort foods" as adults. Food has become both a reward and medication. Research has shown that when we are feeling stressed and vulnerable we seek some way of making the uncomfortable feelings go away. We recall our "rewards" in our earlier days and we reach for unhealthy snacks like ice cream, cookies, cake, chips, etc. that allows us to mother ourselves. A sweet or salty treat is what mother might have ordered, right?

Like all addictions it takes over the focus of our lives. Eating in secret, hiding food, binging, throwing up, compulsive exercising and taking laxatives are symptoms of an eating disorder. Diabetes, anorexia, bulimia and obesity among others, are some of the severe results of this disorder. These are very serious conditions. If caught early they can be treated with positive results. First, we need to ask ourselves, " Why do we do these things to ourselves? What empty space are we trying to fill in our lives?" The next obvious question is, "Is what I am doing working for me?" and If not, "What can I do about it?"

Like other addictions, you have to own it. Denial doesn't work. Just being aware is not enough. Acknowledging and addressing the underlying source of the stress is essential. Some people have used dieting aids such as: shots, pills, liquids, and even starvation which may bandaid or temporarily mask the stress. Since the origin of the problem is not resolved they may switch to another unhealthy addiction like alcohol or drugs. Just being aware may not be enough. Addressing the underlying source may be difficult. The process of changing your outlook and your lifestyle may be challenging but the end result may offer you a more satisfying and comfortable life. Most of the time it is hard to do by yourself, you may need outside support. Remember anything worthwhile usually takes time and effort. Start the New Year with a new goal and keep your eye on it. Make a commitment to yourself that you deserve better because YOU are worth it.



Internet/Facebook Rules of Thumb

Not sure of the etiquette of interacting with others online? We've got some good information for you:

- Always assume any image you see on the internet is copyrighted and permission must be obtained to use it. Even images on sites where you pay to download the image have rules about how the image may be used. Remember to read the terms of use. (The law in this area has had to evolve to cover online publishing/posting. If you post a photo on the internet it is a defacto publishing for copyright sake and permission must be granted to use the image by the copyright holder.)
- Never copy a Facebook posting you like and repost it without permission. Etiquette is that you "SHARE" postings from other pages so the original page is credited with the information. This is mainly important when posting/sharing from business pages, such as MyMotherlode's or PML's page.
- NEVER give out personal information via the internet or email. Hundreds of thousands of scam emails are sent out every day asking you to click through to verify information for what seems like a reputable company. Never click these links, even if it is a company you know, go directly to their website and log in, do not follow the links in the email.
- Be careful with what you post online. Many

users of Facebook have their information set as "Public". Many times this includes phone numbers, birthdays, emails, and even in some cases addresses. Check your "ABOUT" settings on Facebook and make sure any personal information is removed or set to "Only Me".

- Be careful when writing emails or posts. Many arguments have begun online because of simple misunderstandings. Remember, ALL CAPS means that you are yelling, upset, or or excited. Saying something sarcastic may be interpreted as mean, regardless of intent, since the reader cannot tell your tone. Be concise and if it is sarcasm think about adding (Sarcasm) or at least a lol on the posting.
- Some common abbreviations found in postings:

lol - laugh out loud

rotfl - rolling on the floor laughing

Imao - laughing my a** off

rotflmao - Combines the above two into - rolling on the floor laughing my a** off

btw - by the way

jk or j/k - just kidding

np - no problem

omg - Oh My Gosh (God)

tmi - too much information

HELPING HANDS FACTS... DID YOU KNOW?

Here are few factoids about Helping Hands Thrift Store and Furniture Barn that you may not know.

- We have been in existence as a nonprofit organization continually since 1982
- Our current location is our 4th we started upstairs in the Hetch Hetchy Admin Building in Moccasin; moved to where the Firefall Coffee House is now, then to where the Foothills Church is now and our longest home, our current location.
- We are currently open at the Thrift Store Monday – Saturday and at the Furniture Barn Wednesday – Saturday.
- We have a web site (helpinghandsofgroveland.com) and a Facebook Page (Helping Hands of Groveland Thrift Store and Furniture Barn) that posts the sales each week as well as our hours, what can and cannot be donated and other useful information
- At any time there are between 75 and 80 volunteers that work at least once a month, and many work more often than that. Many have been volunteers for at least 10 years.
- We have 3 current volunteers that are founding members and have worked continually since the beginning – Jackie Abbott, Hanna Bodle and Dale Elliott
- Each day there is at least a 4 person team that works the Store, in addition to a Barn volunteer when it's open
- We have Department Managers that do specific areas: Jewelry; Books, Movies & Music; Toys; Linens; Crafts; Electronics and Appliances
- We only pay 1 person, our custodian, and all others are volunteers
- There is a Board of Directors made up of 7 volunteers, who also work in the Store, Barn or both
- Except for our operating expenses

and our custodian, we give our revenue back to the community, including the local schools

- We accept all seasons of donations all year long - if they're out of season, we store them
- We cannot have donations left when we are not open – it's actually against the law, especially to leave things in front of the Barn and the Store, which is on a State Highway.
- We only have room in the Store to put out the current season's clothing, even at that, we are quite crowded
- We've had 2 giveaways each year since 2005 in which we give away at least 100 33 gallon bags of out of season clothing and overstock items at each one— that's been approximately 1800- 33 gallon bags of items given away so far (approximately 45,000 lbs or 22.5 TONS!).
- We supply InterFaith in Sonora with clothing that is sub-standard for our Store, but still in good condition, giving them about 100 33 gallon bags a month, which is about 25,000 lbs, or 12.5 tons per year
- Unfortunately, although we get literally tons of wonderful donations each year, we have quite a large garbage bill. Many donations are not up to our standards, are broken, or just need to be thrown away.
- We don't purchase anything except our supplies – everything we sell is donated
- ITEMS WE TAKE ARE: Adult, children and infant clothing, shoes, purses, collectibles, housewares, home décor, books, VHS tapes, CD's DVD's, cassettes, linens, toys, jewelry, sporting goods, small electrical appliances, craft supplies, fabric, furniture, holiday items ALL IN GOOD CONDITION PLEASE
- WHAT WE DON'T TAKE:

 Magazines, record albums, computer hardware, large electrical appliances, mattresses, cribs, snow skis, anything broken, dirty or in bad condition, BBQ's, construction or plumbing materials (sinks, toilets, etc) TV's, microwave ovens, exercise

machines, children's car seats, Encyclopedias, text books, home recorded VHS tapes, pianos, food.






