# PML TENNIS CLUB



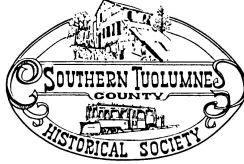

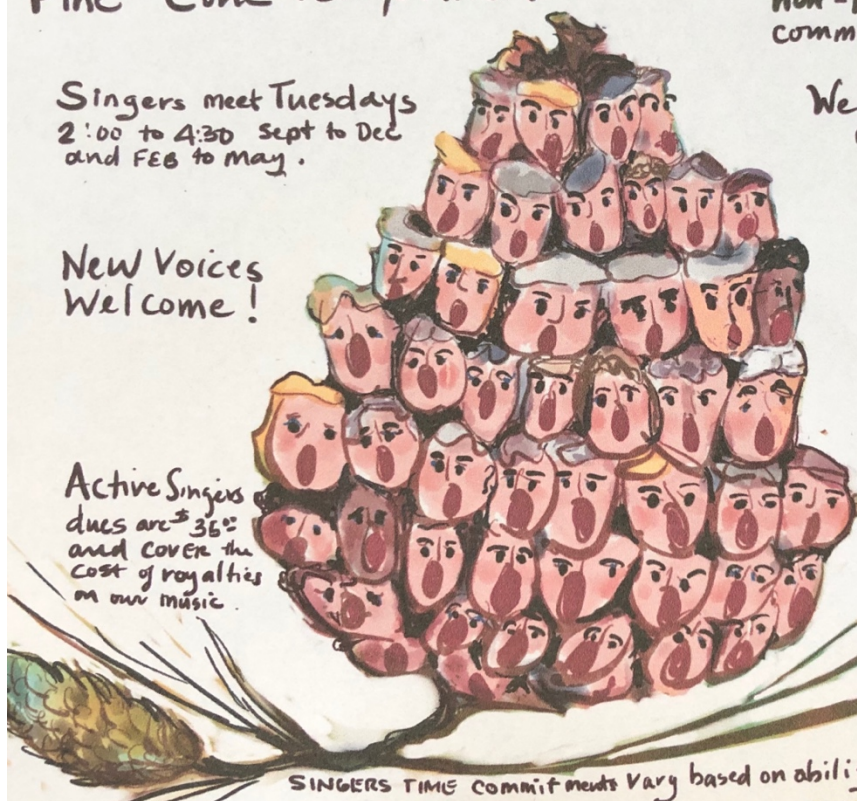

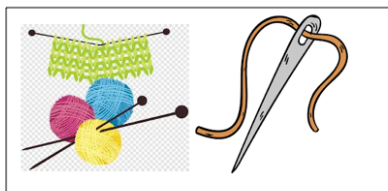

Come check out our beautiful library right in downtown Groveland! We are in the building with the museum. Our Groveland Library has a lot to offer besides books! We are part of the Tuolumne County library system, so if we don't have a book at our branch we can request from any of the libraries in the system and also from the state wide Link+ system. WiFi and Computers for the public are available. We also have a new learning computer for the young ones without internet,

- **FRIDAY STORYTIME:** Fridays at 10:30 we have Storytime for the young children 0 to 5 yrs. Our volunteers are great readers and entertain the young ones with stories. The **Born to Read** program encourages reading and visiting the library. Children are given a punch card and after 10 punches they receive a free book. They also receive a free book for registering for the Born to read program. Their card is punched for coming to Storytime, checking out books, getting their immunizations and getting a library card. There is no cost.
- **SUMMER READING PROGRAM:** In the summer the Tuolumne County Main Library in Sonora and the branches have a Summer Reading Program (**SRP**). In Groveland it is on Wednesdays from 2:30 to 3:30 in the downstairs meeting room. Children are given a booklet to fill up with books they read to earn free books. This year's theme is *"Read Beyond the Beaten Path"*. It's just not about reading, there are games and arts and crafts
- **LIBRARY LOT BOOK CLUB:** We meet on the second Friday of every month at 2 pm, (except December), to discuss the book we read. We all read the same book from 49-99 Book Club book in a box.
